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Pastelmat Light Blue – 12 x 16 CO – CarbOthello Pastel Pencils R - Rembrandt

Transfer the drawing of the begonia onto a  $12 \times 16$  piece of light blue Pastelmat. Use a sheet of white Saral paper to transfer or you can trace the design using a light box. Be sure and use a pastel pencil to transfer and not graphite pencil. Pastel will not stick to the graphite.



Basecoat the vase with a **Richeson Pastel R19** soft pastel or a **Rembrandt 545.5 (Red Violet).** Blend the color thoroughly into the paper with a sponge.

Draw in the upper edge of the vase use CO 335 (Magenta), Derwent P200 (Magenta) and add bright pink with Derwent P190 (Coral). Lighten the coral with CO 681 (Flesh Tint Light.) Darken any shadow areas with CO 330 (Purple) and also use CO 750 (Black).



The green of the leaf in the vase is reflected into the center of the upper lip of the vase. Use CO 575 (Leaf Green) with a bright accent of CO 560 (Pale Leaf Green) for that reflection. Darken the color as needed underneath with CO 585 (Olive Green). Use the CO 750 (Black) to darken the color as needed. Use the CO 750 (Black) to outline some withered leaves on the right side that we will return to later.

Using the CO 335 (Magenta), enrich the color in the lip of the vase. Draw in the stem (visible in the center) of the vase with CO 330 (Purple) and color in the stem with Pitt 192 (Indian Red). Darken in places with CO 750 (Black).

Using **CO 325 (Carmine Red Deep)** to color the bright red on the lip on the right-side neck of the vase. Use **Derwent P190 (Coral)** to add highlights. Add more **CO 575 (Leaf Green)** to add another green reflection and brighten with **CO 210 (Orange Yellow)** on top to brighten.

Use CO 100 (White) and Derwent P190 (Coral) to add brighter highlights.

#### **Neck of Vase**

Moving down into the vase, we are using **CO 330 (Purple)** and **CO 750 (Black)** to define the stem of the flowers in the vase. Add details and values to the vase with **CO 335 (Magenta)** and **CO 365 (Violet Light)**.

On the far-right side, color in the shape between the stem and the flowers use **CO 325** (**Carmine Red Deep**). Use **CO 330** (**Purple**) over the red to deepen the value and blend with your finger. Add a little **Derwent P200** (**Magenta**) just to the left of the stem to brighten the area. Sketch in the shape of the stem with **CO 330** (**Purple**). Darken with **CO 750** (**Black**) and **Pitt 192** (**Indian Red**).



Use Soft Pastel Richeson R14 to add a bright light area to the left of the stem and blend with small blender. Add darker color with CO 385 (Violet Deep) and a little CO 335 (Magenta).

Add a strong highlight on the left edge of the neck of the vase with CO 100 (White). Add small dots of highlights in the neck of the vase with CO 100 (White) and Derwent P190 (Coral). Add Derwent P 200 (Magenta) to brighten the area as needed. Continue using CO 335 (Magenta), CO 365 (Violet Light) and Derwent P190 (Coral) to enrich the area in the center of the neck of the bottle.

Use the CO 335 (Magenta), CO 365 (Violet Light) and CO 385 (Violet Deep) to draw in the shadow shapes on the left side of the vase.





Use **Derwent P200 (Magenta)** for brightest pink on the left. Darken areas with **CO 365 (Violet Light)** and **CO 385 (Violet Deep)** with a little **CO 330 (Purple)** to darken.



Use CO 330 (Purple) and CO 750 (Black) to add darks. Add CO 325 (Carmine Red Deep) and a little CO 100 (White) and Richeson R14.



Outline the shapes in the bottom of the vase with CO 335 (Magenta) and sketch in the right stem with CO 330 (Purple).

#### **Droplet on Left Top**

Fill in the droplet with **CO 325 (Carmine Red Deep)** and outline the bottom of the droplet with **CO 750 (Black).** Add a spot of **CO 100 (White)** on top for the highlight.

Add various colors to this area on the left – CO 335 (Magenta), Derwent P190 (Coral), CO 100 (White) and Richeson R14.

Draw the stem with CO 330 (Purple) into the left area (Outline in right side). Add more CO 365 (Violet Light) as you work down into the reflection. Add Richeson R14 on the right side of the stem. Use CO 750 (Black) to darken outside of the vase on the left side. Use CO 210 (Orange Yellow) for flower stamen reflections. Keep using all the previous colors to add details and highlights in this area.

Use **CO 720 (Cold Gray)** to paint in the reflection on the left outside edge. Add a little **CO 750 (Black)** to grey down the color and add bright spots of color with **CO 210 (Orange Yellow)** and **CO 100 (White)** on the outside edge.



Use **Richeson R14 and R15** to add additional color and light to the center of the vase and to the left and right of the stem. Use **Sennelier 384 (Madder Carmine 4)** to add the brightest values at the bottom and blend well.





Add the darkest shadow/reflection at the bottom of the vase with **Richeson R17**.



Outline the dark shape at the bottom with CO 335 (Magenta) and also add CO 330 (Purple). Use CO 325 (Carmine Deep Red) to add a red reflection at the top left of the shadow shape.



Add bright accents of Richeson R14 into the dark shadows. Add more CO 335 (Magenta) over the top of the bottom reflection on the left side. Use CO 365 (Violet Light) to add darker accents into the center areas of the vase. Use the Derwent P190 (Coral) to add lighter accents over the CO 365 (Violet Light).



Use **Sennelier 384 (Madder Carmine 4)** to add bright pink accents.

Use CO 100 (White) for white accents.



Use **CO 685 (Violet Light)** to add dark shadows at the base of the vase. Darken with **CO 750 (Black)**.



Add **Sennelier 323 (Purple Violet 1)** to make bright red violet in the bottom of the vase. Blend into the edge.





Continue to add bright accents around the vase. Add bright white highlight with 100.5R (White) and bright pink with the Sennelier 384 (Madder Carmine 4).

# **Droplets**

Outline the droplets with **CO 365 (Violet Light).**Darken the bottom edge lightly with **CO 750** 

(Black). Add bright pink to the top with Sennelier 384 (Madder Carmine 4). Blend well and add a few shadows with CO 365 (Violet Light).

Outline the stem on the right with CO 330 (Purple) and fill in lightly. Add Pitt 192 (Indian Red) over the purple. Add CO 750 (Black) over the top lightly. Add a few bright accents with CO 325 (Red Carmine Deep) and bright accents with Sennelier 384 (Madder Carmine 4) and CO 100 (White). Add additional bright white accents with 100.5R (White).

Use **CO 720 (Cold Gray 1)** to draw the outside right edge of the lower part of the vase. Fill in at the bottom with **CO 706 (Gray 4)**. Darken the bottom edge with **CO 750 (Black)**. Blend lightly





with small blender. Add accents on the edge

with **Richeson R14** and add brights accents with **Sennelier 384 (Madder Carmine 4)** and **100.5** R (White).

#### Reflection

Draw a white line on the outside bottom edge of the vase with CO 100 (White). Paint the area

closest to the vase with Richeson R14 and add Sennelier 323 (Purple Violet 1) for richer color. Blend. Use CO 335 (Magenta) to add more color into the shadows. Add a bright highlight at the base with 100.5R (White). Use CO 750 (Black) for dark accents at the base of the vase. Use bright pink Sennelier 384 (Madder Carmine 4) for highlights on the edge of the reflection. Use Richeson R14 to add additional bright color into the reflection as it spreads outward



across the table. Add dark red areas with Sennelier 323 (Purple Violet 1) and Richeson R17. Use CO 335 (Magenta) and CO 100 (White) to add light streaks representing the light. Blend. Darken the outside edges of the reflection with CO 750 (Black) and blend the reflection well into the paper, evening out the edges. Add brightest lights with Sennelier 384 (Madder Carmine 4) and add a little Richeson R14.

#### **Begonia Flowers**

#### **Medium Values**

Rembrandt 372.5 Permanent Red CO 325 (Carmine Red Deep) CO 310 (Carmine Red) Conte 39 (Garnet Red)

Dark Values
CO 330 (Purple)
Conte 19 (Purple)
Pitt 192 (Indian Red)
CO 750 (Black)

#### **Light Values**

Conte 49 (Lt Orange CO 221 (Orange) CO 100 (White) Pitt 124 (Rose Carmine) CO 210 (Orange Yellow)

Basecoat with 372.5R (Permanent Red). Blend well with small blender. Use CO 325 (Carmine Red Deep) to even up the edges of the petals and shade (darken) the edges of the petals with Pitt 192 (Indian Red) and CO 330 (Purple).

Add CO 310 (Carmine Red) over the center of the petal and a little CO 100 (White) over the red and blend well. This will lighten the petal in the center giving it depth. You can also add CO 221 (Orange) over the center to lighten a petal. Use Pitt 124 (Rose Carmine) to make light edges. Use Conte 49 (Lt Orange) for very light areas of the petals. Add stamens with CO 210 (Orange Yellow) and CO 221 (Orange).









Continue coloring the blossoms with combinations of middle, dark and light colors listed.


































Flowers are completed and it's time to add the leaf.

#### Leaf

Base coat the leaf with 620.8R (Olive Green). Add dark areas with 627.2R (Cinnabar Green Deep). Blend very well.

Add lights to leaf with

Unison Green
29 and dark areas with
Unison Green
31. Blend.



Add light veins with CO 560 (Leaf Green Pale). Outline the veins with CO 595 (Dark Green) on one side (To represent the shadow). Outline the outside edge of the leaf facing the light with CO 100 (White).

Add more **Unison Green 29** for lights
and dark areas with **Unison Green 31**. As
needed. Blend.



Outline the outside edge of the leaf facing the light with CO 100 (White). Add the brown dried buds on the left with Pitt 192 (Indian Red) and CO 100 (White) for highlights.

Use CO 585 (Olive Green) to add small little lines to the leaf. Use CO 575 (Leaf Green) to shade the leaf. Use CO 595 (Dark Green) for dark shadows of the veins.

Highlight between little veins with **CO 570** (Leaf Green Middle).



Texture the leaf with small dabs of **Unison Green 29.** Add background with **Mt Vision 544** (**Midnight Blue**) around the bottom of the vase and reflection.
